Please describe your background, experience, and qualifications for this office:

My academia includes a BS in Agricultural Education and Environmental Science with a research focus in Wetland Bioremediation and Swine Husbandry and MS in Agricultural Economics and Rural Development. My doctoral program was is Energy and Environmental Systems and Economics, and recently I graduated from law school. I'm currently pursuing license to practice law, in California first where my law school is located. Science, economics and law are arguably the primary aspects of governance. I'm also an entrepreneur and community leader providing social relief services to disadvantaged persons.

Why are you running for this office?

To restore aptitude and competence to the mayoral seat, because Charlotte has been plagued with supposed public servants who tout good intentions but are inept for the scope of work, ethical rigor and responsibility for this seat or any seat in government.

Please describe your top 2 or 3 priorities if elected and how they would affect the daily lives of people in your community:

Apt and competent candidates should NOT run on "top priorities" except where of course a candidate's priority should always be equity and democratic governance because such is the very purpose of our elections. Any purpose opposite thereto demonstrates a self-serving motive, and should alarm voters. That said, and incorporating the colloquial nature of the question, high ethical rigor, equity, collaborative leadership are always amongst my top priorities. Tackling environmental sustainability, affordable housing, crime, better interagency relations, infrastructure flows naturally therefrom.

Finally, how would you help ensure young people, including area college students, have a voice in local government and the decisions that affect the community?

I've already long since before first running for office in 2013 mentored youth from ages 12 to 18, and college students of all ages, primarily 25 and under. I have empowered them with vocational education in home and business economics, law, environmental stewardship, time management, elections and politics, and community development. When I filed my notice of candidacy for this race, I announced my proposal for the co-mayoral forum. I've slated several Charlotte youth and young adults to serve as spokespersons for their peers. I'll take their issues to the council to inform decision making.
